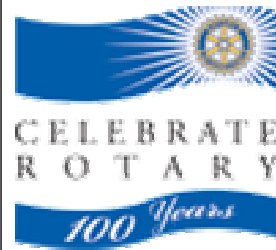

**Joe Unger** gave a thankful buck because Roberta had exploratory surgery and the results were benign.

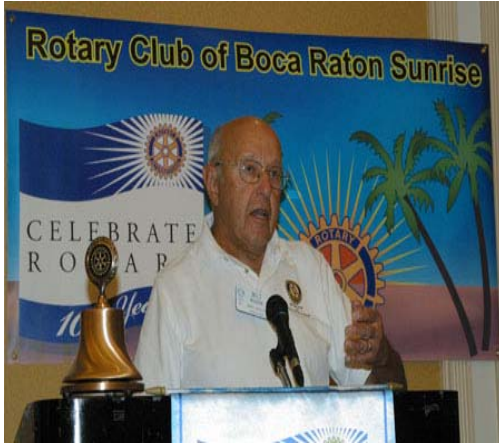

**SPEAKER OF THE WEEK  
MILT RUDICK – HURRICANES**

**Milt Rudick** needed no introduction, he is a retired engineer and has been a member of the Boca Sunrise Club for years and has many years of service in his home town club in Akron, Ohio.

The danger of hurricanes of a category 4 nature are the water surges, Milt began. As you get inland, the wind will be reduced. Milt gained experience after his retirement in Ohio from Hurricane Hugo, he took an assignment in Charlotte, North Carolina.

Flying objects, shingles, chairs, trees can damage house. In the uplift, the wind has low air pressure. Nature tries to equalize this, and therefore sometimes will pick up and lift the roof off of a home. If you can, one of the best ways to relieve the air pressure is to open a window on the leeward side of the building.

Milt explained how homes have been built, with steel connectors at the bottom of trusses and concrete beams reinforcing the buildings every 16 inches. This holds the house down as it is trying to lift in the wind.

He has drained off the old sediment in his hot water heater for additional water supply, and told us to find a safe room. He mentioned that if we experience large rainfall, the area West of 441 may turn into a flood zone.

Other advice given was to turn your freezer to its coldest setting, and to store large amounts of ice and frozen water in the freezer. Avoid opening the refrigerator in case of the power outages that are sure to come.

Remember to store your documents in a safe place. Fill your bathtubs with water; and disconnect all appliances.

When he worked with the insurance companies, he identified one home that had floated away because the fish-shaped sign that had been blown off was not painted behind the house number. Identify your property!

The code in houses built after 1994 is to have new buildings withstand hurricane winds up to 120 per hour; but this hurricane has already had winds of 145 miles per hour.
